What are Cookies

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your machine to help the site provide a better user experience. In general, cookies are used to retain user preferences, store information for things like shopping carts, and provide anonymised tracking data to third party applications like Google Analytics. As a rule, cookies will make your browsing experience better. However, you may prefer to disable cookies on this site and on others.

The most effective way to do this is to disable cookies in your browser. We suggest consulting the Help section of your browser or taking a look at [the About Cookies website](#) which offers guidance for all modern browsers

How we use Cookies

We use necessary cookies to make our website work. Weâ??d also like to set analytics cookies that help us make improvements by measuring how you use our website. These will be set only if you accept them. We do not use cookies to collect or pass any personally identifiable or sensitive information to advertisers or third parties.

Types of Cookies we use

Necessary or Functional Cookies

Necessary cookies are required to enable the basic features of this site, such as providing secure log-in or adjusting your consent preferences. These cookies do not store any personally identifiable data.

Cookie	Duration	Description
cookie_alert	1 year	Enables use of the cookie acceptance pop up on the website and settings to be remembered. It does not collect or store any personal information about the site visitors.

Cookie	Duration	Description
wordpress_test_cookie	Session	WordPress sets a cookie named wordpress_test_cookie to check if the cookies are enabled on the browser to provide an appropriate user experience for the user. This cookie is used on the front-end, even if you are not logged in.

Performance/Analytical Cookies

Analytical cookies are used to understand how visitors interact with the website. These cookies help provide information on metrics such as the number of visitors, bounce rate, traffic source, etc.

Cookie	Duration	Description
_ga	2 years	The _ga cookie, installed by Google Analytics, calculates visitor, session, campaign data, and also keeps track of site usage for the site's analytics report. The cookie stores information anonymously and assigns a randomly generated number to recognise unique visitors. For more information on how Google uses data see Google's Privacy and Terms .
ga*	2 years	Google Analytics sets this cookie to store and count page views. Used by Google Analytics to distinguish individual users on our website. The cookie is used to store information of how visitors use a website and helps in creating an analytics report of how the website is doing. The data collected including the number visitors, the source where they have come from, and the pages visited in an anonymous form. Third Party Cookies

Third-party cookies are generated and placed on the user's device by a different website other than the one the user is visiting. They are created when a user visits a website that includes elements from other sites, such as third-party images or ads. If a server hosting one of these elements responds to the request by setting a cookie, that cookie is stored on the user's browser.

YouTube

We embed videos from our official YouTube channel using YouTube's privacy-enhanced mode. This mode may set cookies on your computer when you arrive on a page containing a YouTube video. The cookies do not directly identify individual users and YouTube will not store information to personalise your experience unless you are logged in to a Google account.
